Raising Awareness about Pollinators and Climate Change during Pollinator Week 2023

Pollinator Week 2023 (June 19-25) is the seventeenth consecutive year of bringing greater awareness to the critically important issue of pollinator conservation since Pollinator Partnership (P2) founded the initiative in 2007. Similar to years past, Pollinator Week will be marked by habitat actions workshops, and festivals striving to promote pollinators and the important conservation work being done on their behalf across the world.

"With nearly all of the United States' Governors proclaiming support for Pollinator Week and many international activities taking place, this year's pollinator week is farther reaching than ever before. We hope the message of the interconnectedness between pollinators and climate change will influence individuals across the globe to join our work to protect pollinators, people, and the planet," said Pollinator Partnership's Executive Director, Kelly Bills.

Pollinator Partnership will again co-host a week-long Pollinator Power Party with the Electric Power Research Institute (EPRI), June 19-23.
