

Proclamation

By the Governor of Alabama

WHEREAS, pollinator species such as birds and insects are essential partners of farmers and ranchers in producing much of our food supply; and

WHEREAS, pollination plays a vital role in the health of our national forests and grasslands, which provide forage, fish and wildlife, timber, water, mineral resources, and recreational opportunities. It also provides enhanced economic development opportunities for communities; and

WHEREAS, pollinator species provide significant environmental benefits that are necessary for maintaining healthy, biodiverse ecosystems; and

WHEREAS, the state of Alabama has managed wildlife habitats and public lands such as Alabama forests and grasslands for decades; and

WHEREAS, the state of Alabama provides producers with conservation assistance to promote wise conservation stewardship, including the protection and maintenance of pollinators and their habitats on working lands and wildlands;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kay Ivey, Governor of Alabama, do hereby proclaim June 17 through June 23, as

Alabama Pollinator Week

in the state of Alabama.
